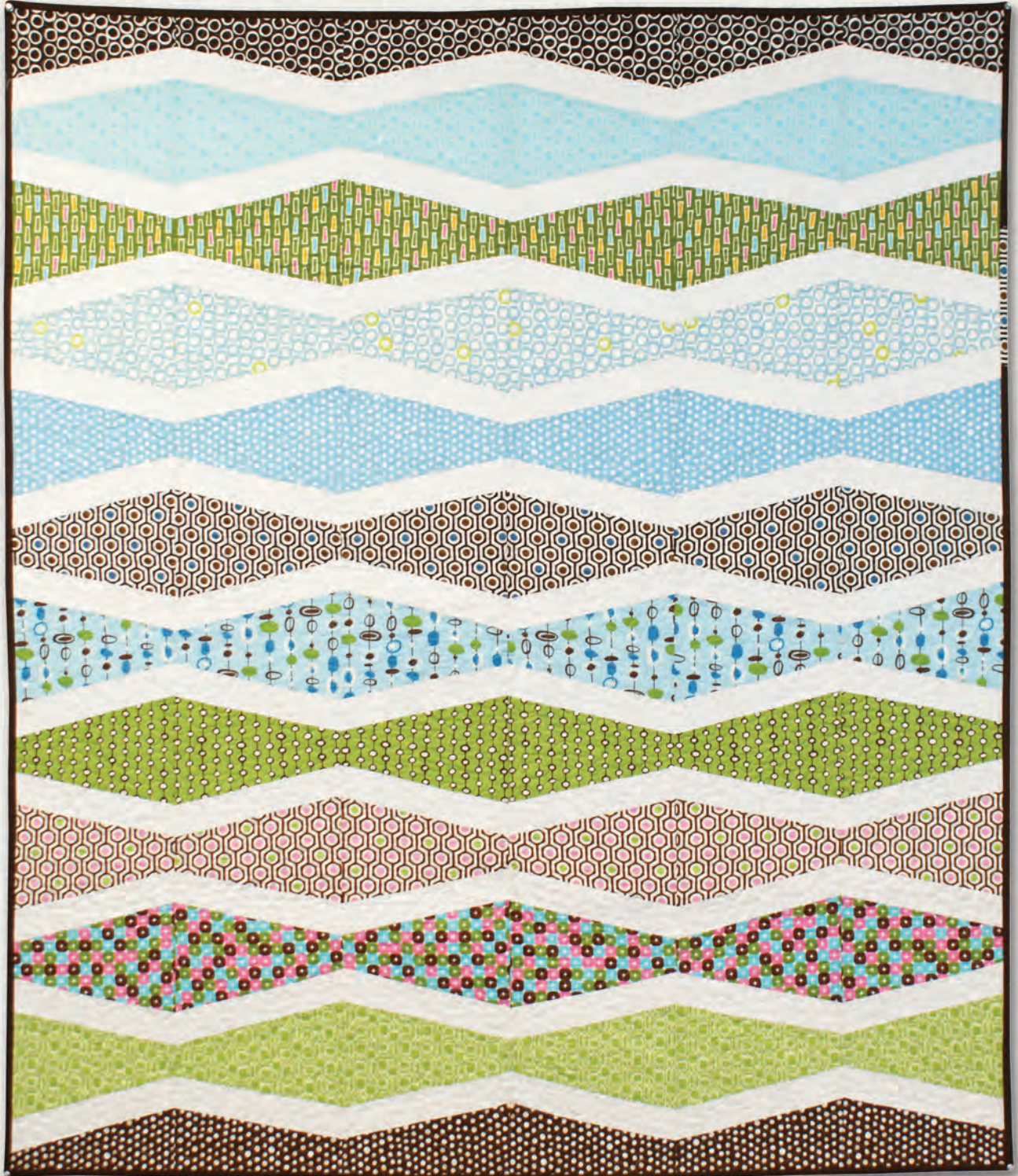

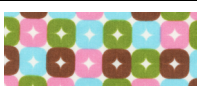

New Wave Quilt

Quilt is approx. 51" x 55" finished

Supplies

6" x 9" Translucent Template Plastic

12 assorted Print Fat Quarters

1 yard Solid Sashing Fabric

3 – 1/2 yards Fabric for Backing

55" x 62" Batting

1/2 yard Fabric for Binding

Cutting Instructions

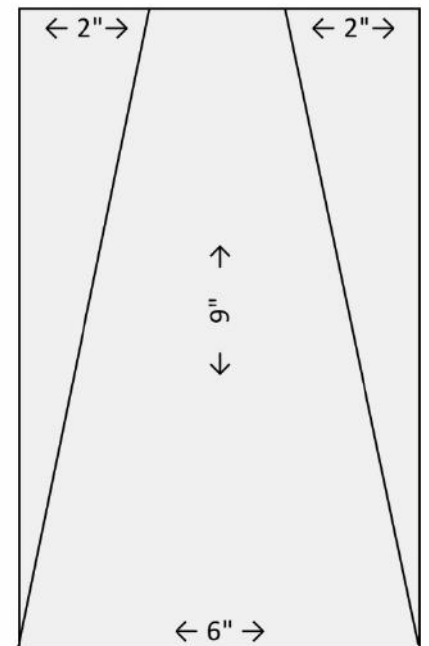
Template Plastic: Place 6" x 9" template plastic on your cutting mat. (6" sides are top and bottom.) Measure 2" in from the top-left and top-right corners and mark. Align your ruler between the lower-left corner and the left-most mark you made on the top. Cut. Repeat with the lower-right corner and right-most mark on the top. (See diagram at right.)

Fat Quarters: From each, cut 2 strips 9" x 18".

Solid Sashing Fabric: Cut 17 strips 2" x width of fabric. Subcut each strip into 4 sashing pieces 2" x 10" (66 total).

Backing Fabric: Cut 1 piece 59" x width of fabric, and 1 piece 59" x 25".

Binding Fabric: Cut 6 strips 2 1/2" x width of fabric.



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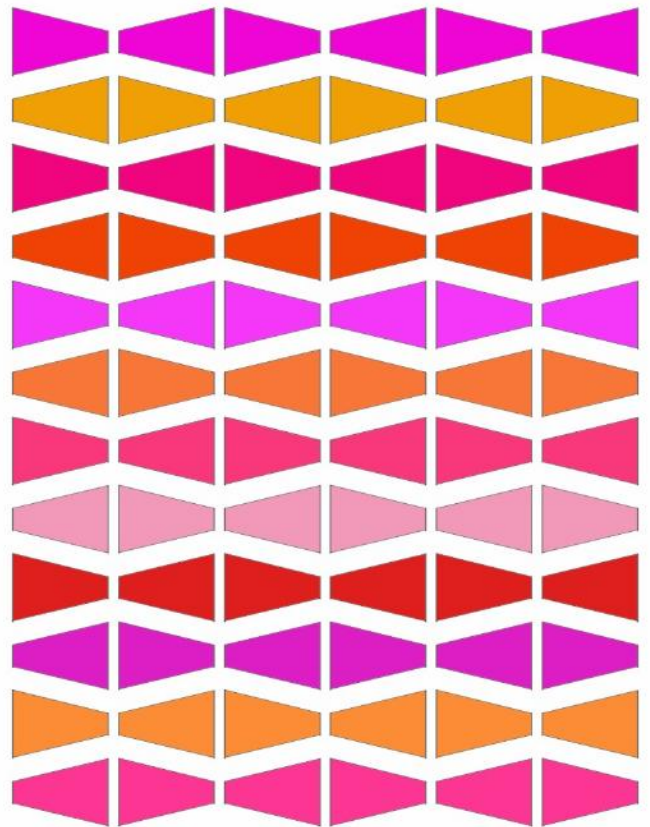
Use your template to cut a total of 6 blocks from the 9" strips you cut from each fat quarter.

Once you've cut 6 blocks from each fat quarter, lay them out as indicated in the diagram at right.

Keep in mind that the top and bottom rows will be trimmed to make the quilt edge straight, so that's probably not the best place to put your favorite prints!

Because of the angles involved, the quilt is finished by sewing the blocks into vertical columns and then sewing the columns together. Each column will include one block cut from each print.

The following piecing instructions assume a 1/4" seam allowance with all seams pressed open.





Starting with the first column of blocks, sew a sashing piece to the bottom of every block in the column, except the very bottom one.



Square up the sashing with the straight (6" and 2") sides of each block.



Taking care to keep them in the correct order, sew the sashed blocks together, adding the bottom block (the one that doesn't have sashing) at the bottom of the column.



Repeat with the other 5 columns, making 6 total. As you piece the columns, take care to keep the blocks in the same order in each.



Sew the 6 columns together to complete the quilt top.



Square up the top and bottom edges.

Finishing the Quilt:

Sew the two backing pieces together along the 59" sides, inserting a scrap-pieced strip between the two pieces, if desired.

Sandwich, quilt and bind as desired. Please reference my blog for more specific tutorials on making a quilt sandwich, free-motion quilting and making double-fold binding.
